3. **zone:** Area. UPS has another chart which puts areas of the country in certain zones. Once you know the zone that the parcel is going to you can calculate how much it will cost to ship the parcel. Locating the zone is covered on other worksheets.
 4. **prompt:** quick
 5. **day-Definite:** Through their web-site or by placing a call, UPS can give its shipping customers a definite day of delivery. For example, if you call on Tuesday to mail a parcel to California, UPS can give you the date the parcel will be delivered to California from the zip code from which you are shipping.
 6. **contiguous:** touching. This refers to the 48 continental U.S. states--the ones that touch one another--not Alaska nor Hawaii.
 7. **Lbs.:** an abbreviation for pounds.
